Safety Letter: The attached safety letter reviews Jefferson School's on-site and off-site evacuation locations as well as specifics from our School Safety Plan.

GATE: Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) testing is open to all third through eighth graders who have not taken the OLSAT 8 in the past three years. The two possible ways to qualify for GATE for 2016-2017 will be through the Otis-Lennon School Ability Test (OLSAT) or through the teacher recommendation / portfolio process. The OLSAT test will

be given to eligible 3rd - 8th graders in October and eligible 2nd - 7th graders in March. Testing will occur after school at your child's school site. The testing schedule can be found below. Parents are responsible for student transportation. If you would like your child to participate in the upcoming GATE testing, please contact the school office and ask for a GATE application or go to the Jefferson School District Website (www.jeffersonschooldistrict.com).

After School Pickup: The San Joaquin County Department of Public Works and Transportation Engineering visited our school this past week to assess our traffic flow in the afternoon. To ensure the safety of all, the County will be implementing changes to our current drop-off and pick-up procedures. They are placing "No Parking" (or standing of vehicle) signs along the inbound turn lane on Linne Road. After signage is up, the County will also have CHP in the area during drop-off and pick-up hours to check that cars are not waiting in the turn lane on Linne Road or in the driving lane on Chrisman Road.

Please do your part by parking in the parking lots if you are arriving prior to 3:00pm and the drive through lane is full. We cannot have cars sticking out into the street. Your child can walk across the crosswalks to your car. This will adequately clear the two areas in which cars are currently waiting. Once the bell rings, traffic can flow through the drive through lane as usual. Thank you for your cooperation.

ELAC: California Education Code Section 62002.5 requires that an ELAC be established at each school where there are 20 or more identified English Learner (EL) students. The responsibilities of this committee are to advise the school on various EL issues, services and programs and to elect a representative to the District English Learner Advisory Committee (DELAC). The first ELAC meeting will be September 28th at 3:30 in our Media Room.

Dear Parents/Guardians.

In order to provide a safe, secure and healthy environment for your child, Jefferson School updates its School Safety Plan each year. In addition to updating our written plan (which includes procedures for fire drills, earthquake drills, lockdown drills, etc.), Jefferson School's staff makes sure that each classroom is equipped with a first aid kit and a copy of emergency procedures.

The Jefferson School Crisis Response team will operate the evacuation site to ensure a safe and orderly pick-up/release of students. When picking up a student, parents/guardians (or person on emergency card) must bring a photo I.D. Without verification, staff will not release any student.

Jefferson School's onsite evacuation/reunification area: Cafeteria

Jefferson School's off site evacuation/reunification site: Jefferson Business Park Address: 7505 W. Linne Road, Tracy, CA 95304

Jefferson's secondary off site evacuation/reunification site: Triple E Produce Address: 8690 W. Linne road, Tracy, CA 95304

If the school is involved in a lock-down situation, the secondary evacuation site is the designated meeting area where parents/guardians should wait for information and the release of their student into their care. School and District personnel will be on site at the evacuation center to provide parents with information about the status and safety of their student(s). DO NOT go directly to the school in the event of a lock-down or evacuation. Parents/guardians can also listen to local media (KVON AM 1440; KVYN FM 99.3; KBBF FM 89.1) for the updates on the emergency situation, but your best source of up-to-date information will be at the evacuation site.
